Hold the Dates: November 17th – Fr. Tim Schehr returns this year for an engaging presentation on the story of the Raising of Lazarus as presented in the Gospel of John. Fr. Schehr's explanations of Scripture are clear and insightful. November 22nd – Advent Family Gathering (wreath-making); December 2nd – Advent Evening for Women: wine, food, friendship and Advent reflection by Sr. Lucy Zientek, CDP.

This Monday evening, November 9th, 7:00-8:30 pm, Nativity will host an evening of information regarding the Death Penalty and what we can do to end this in Ohio. Speakers are former Ohio Corrections Chief, Terry Collins who oversaw 33 executions; Derrick Jamison, a Death Row exoneree; and Sr. Alice Gerdeman, CDP, a longtime abolition activist.

One Faith, One Hope, One Love campaign supports Catholic Charities and Social Services: As an expression of our Catholic faith, we serve the poor and vulnerable through two agencies, Catholic Charities of Southwestern Ohio and Catholic Social Services of the Miami Valley. The 131,000 people served annually through these agencies include many who are out of work for the first time, families with young children, older adults, caregivers, refugees/immigrants, at-risk youth, women in crisis pregnancies, and those who benefit from mental health counseling. The One Faith, One Hope, One Love campaign has a goal of raising \$130 million of which \$10 million will be used to enable families to improve their life situations through care management programs including job readiness, literacy, healthy choices, GED, financial and legal service programs.
