You take the gift tag, which lists a person's name and their Christmas wish, and underneath it, a smaller "phone" tag to record your name and phone number. You take the gift tag home, BUT vou need to fill out the smaller tag right away in church for each gift selected and put it in the box. This is important so that we can check that all gifts are turned in...so no one is left without a gift. Note: Star shaped tags for Birthright do not have phone tags...because they do not go to specific individuals. 2) Wrap and Attach Gift Tags: Wrap your gift(s) and attach the gift tag securely with the name facing up. If your gift is a GIFT CARD, please put the card in a box and wrap it so it does not get lost. Note: Items to Birthright do not need to be wrapped. 3) **RETURN** ALL GIFTS BY NOON ON SUNDAY, DECEMBER 11TH. Bring your gift(s) to church by noon on Sunday, December 11th.
