## July 12, 2020 – Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### **Before you arrive:**

Check your temperature: if you have a fever, please do not come to church.

Stay home if you are ill.

Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear.

Bring hand sanitizer with you if available. We will have some for use as well.

### **When you arrive:**

Enter only in marked doorways at the main entrance.

Please stop by the greeter for any necessary directions.

Always keep your face covering on at Mass except for when receiving Communion.

Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter.

Always observe social distancing (look for marks on the floor).

Usher will direct you to pews, starting in the front and working towards the back of church.

Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please mail your contribution or submit it online.

### **During the Mass:**

Do not change seats during the Mass.

There will be no passing of offering baskets.

No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass.

### **Follow instructions for Communion:**

Leave your seat only when directed by the usher or greeter.

Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line...look for marks on the floor.

When 12 feet or two people away from the priest/distributor, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces.

Approach the priest/distributor only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering: Extend a single hand to receive the Host; After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host; Replace your face covering or mask; Follow instructions to return to your pew.

### **After the Service:**

Worship aids you may have brought with you, please take them home.

You will be dismissed by pew or seating area.

Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher. Use only the designated exit doors.

Do not congregate outside the church doors.

### **DISPENSATION**

The Catholic faithful who reside in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and all other Catholics in the archdiocese continue to be dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass. Those who are at risk or fearful that they or their family might become sick are encouraged to stay home and join the Church by viewing live-streamed Masses.

**Hand Sanitizer Outreach Project:** This was explained in the Nativity Parish Community Facebook page. We would like to provide hand sanitizers for patients of one of our "parishioner-doctors" who cannot afford these. A list of parishioners in various neighborhoods who will have a container on their porch to receive these donations or you can bring it to church. ### ***Dear Nativity Community,***

After careful consideration and in consultation with Fr. Eric, Parish leadership, and the COVID Response Team, we have made the difficult decision to cancel this year's Festival. This was not an easy decision to make however one that we think is in the best interest of the health and safety of our parish and the greater community. This decision was driven by: Social distancing requirements would require additional volunteers to ensure the number of people on the grounds does not exceed the number of people permitted. As signage and efforts would need to be in place to ensure social distancing at booths, lines for food, vendors, in the rummage sale, Bid N Buy, and children's area; all visitors to the grounds would need to have to wear face masks; additional volunteers and supplies would be needed to clean booths, games, tables, and chairs between each use; hand sanitizer stations would need to be placed throughout the grounds; restrooms would need to be cleaned on a more regular basis during the festival (every 30 minutes) to ensure sanitation; and by canceling now we eliminate all the non-refundable deposits that are required to secure items for the festival. The committee is investigating a possible online Grand Raffle and Bid N Buy to be held sometime in 2020. We will update you when we have more information. We hope to resume the festival in the fall of 2021. To help ensure a successful festival in 2021, the members of the committee have all agreed to stay on to help plan it. We appreciate everyone's hard work and commitment to the festival and hope you will help us celebrate when it is safe again.
