This year's Conway Lecture will be presented by Dr. Jeff Zalar, the Ruth J. and Robert A. Conway Endowed Chair in Catholic Studies at the University of Cincinnati on Wednesday, April 13th, from 7:00-8:30 pm, Annie Laws Room (Teacher's College Building), Room #407. The lecture clarifies the foundations of contemporary academic endeavor, demonstrating how much Catholic intellectuals and secular scholars hold in common and what they and their students stand to gain from dialogue with one another. While acknowledging the historical antagonism between religious and secular sources of knowledge, the presenter contends that this antagonism is dated and unhelpful towards a full flowering of university learning culture.

WE DID IT...Nativity reaches it's One Faith, One Hope, One Love campaign goal!! Nativity has surpassed its goal of raising \$725,000 in pledges for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati's One Faith, One Hope, One Love campaign. To date, we have received \$727,000 in pledges from 234 families which includes the matching donation for new pledges from our very generous parishioner. Although Nativity has 670 registered families, our 35% level of participation is much better than most parishes in our Archdiocese. As you are aware, money raised from the campaign goes to support Catholic education, fostering vocations, caring for retired diocesan priests, and Catholic charities and social services. Twenty percent of the donations come back to Nativity to support projects on campus. Moreover, sixty percent of donations received beyond the \$725,000 come back to Nativity to support projects on campus.
