RCIA: Members of our RCIA have spent the past weeks in the Inquiry Period, listening, talking, praying and learning with team members as they discerned God's call to them. Now they are proclaiming publicly in the Rite of Acceptance their decision to become members of the Church. And the assembly in turn accepts them as catechumens intending to join the Church. At the 4:30 Mass we welcome Jessica Wiles and her son Hank and their sponsors; and Caitlyn Sanderson with her Nativity sponsor Jeanne Longeway. Please hold them in prayer as they look forward to the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

One Faith, One Hope, One Love campaign supports Catholic Charities and Social Services: When Archdiocesan priests retire, they continue to make an impact on the spiritual and personal lives of Catholics of all ages. They celebrate Mass in area parishes, visit the sick and homebound, and bring God's word to those in prison. After a lifetime of service, no priest should face retirement with financial uncertainty. There are currently 87 priests receiving benefits from the retirement fund, and projections indicate within the next 5 years that number may grow to 140. Nativity's goal is \$725,000. To date, Nativity has \$310,350 in pledges from 43 families and has reached 43% of its goal. Volunteers continue to reach out to as many families as possible. Please respond generously to their efforts so we may reach our goal before Christmas!

Nativity is turning 100 and we need your help! In 2017, Nativity will celebrate its centennial and we need your stories to tell the history of our parish.
