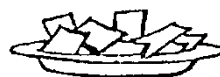

Calling on Compassionate Co-workers in Bereavement:

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." In the Beatitudes from his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus invites his disciples to accompany those who are grieving. To pray for the living and the dead is a spiritual work of mercy. To bury the dead is a corporal work of mercy. If you desire to extend the mercy of Jesus into the world, consider becoming part of the Bereavement Team at Nativity of Our Lord parish.

There are three parts to this ministry in the parish:

1. Assist families in preparing the funeral liturgy;
2. Be present during the liturgy to walk with the family in whatever might be needed (e.g., bringing up the gifts, finding the place in the lectionary for the reading, etc.);
3. Help with the optional luncheon afterward. Due to COVID, Nativity is not hosting luncheons at the moment. The more immediate need is for generous disciples to offer their time and talent to help families prepare for and walk together through the funeral liturgy.

A good fit for this volunteer opportunity is someone with a flexible schedule, a gentle presence, and a prayerful spirit during Mass. The parish provides booklets and training to equip volunteers to help the family prepare the funeral liturgy. Contact Sr. Janet for more information.
